FROM THE PASTOR'S CORNER

3rd Sunday of Lent, Year "B" "Destroy this Temple ... I will Raise it up"

A young disciple approached his Master and asked, 'Master, you always tell us to be kind and compassionate. But what is compassion?'

After thinking, the wise teacher asked the young student to peek out the window. Master led him to the window and directed his attention to the beggar sitting on the corner of the street. While looking at him, they noticed that an old lady had walked by and given him a coin.

After a while, a merchant, wearing elaborate clothes passed by and gave him five coins to the beggar.

After a while, a mother and a child passed the street. The young child noticed the beggar and handed him a flower he was carrying.

After looking at these three incidents, the Master asked the student, "Which of these do you believe felt the most compassion for the beggar?"

"Merchant did as he gave the beggar five coins," answered the young pupil.

The Master smiled at the pupil and answered, "You see, an elderly lady passing by was infuriated by the beggar's poverty, so she gave him a gold coin." The old lady behaved out of pity for the beggar.

After that, we observed a merchant see a small gathering of people talking about him, so he handed the beggar five coins and swiftly left. Merchant acted with pride. He wanted to show off his money to those folks while demonstrating that he has a huge kind heart and enjoys helping others. He tried to up his social image and boost his ego.

Later, we noticed a child carrying some flowers, and when he walked by the beggar, he smiled and handed him a flower. He did not have pride or pity or want to boost his ego or social image. He acted with love. That little child was the one who responded compassionately."

"Compassion is considerably larger and nobler than pity," Master said. Fear is the source of pity. When fear touches someone's anguish, it turns into pity; when love touches someone's pain and suffering, it becomes compassion.

So, to comprehend compassion, we must recognize that all beings are the same and suffer in a similar manner. We must acknowledge those who suffer and realize that we are neither different nor superior to anybody." (All Time Short Stories)

Jesus is the wisdom and compassion of God par excellence. In Jesus, God gave the greatest sign to the world. For the Jews to stand before Jesus, and after hearing and seeing all that Jesus said and did before them and yet demand for a sign, demonstrates ignorance and a lack of faith in both God. For, even nature reveals the humanity and divinity of Jesus as Lord and God.

We know and do appreciate the importance of signs in the world. Imagine how difficult it will be to drive in Los Angeles without traffic signs. We certainly need to have signs in the world. Jesus knows and understands the importance of signs hence He always used signs and wonders to unfold the mysteries of the kingdom of God.

However, due to the stubbornness of their heart the Jews were not demanding signs from nature but directly from God. What the Jews were saying is that God should speak directly to them and not through Jesus. The Jews seem to forget that in all generations, places and times, God has always used mere human beings to reveal His goodness and glory, and Jesus is a perfect sign of the existence, the presence and the glory of God.

Jesus did not allow Himself to be weighed down by the doubts and hardness of heart of the Jews. Jesus would rather go on to demonstrate His divinity in word and action by cleansing the temple. The temple is to the Jews the visible sign of God's presence in the world. It is a holy place of encounter with the divine. Hence, the temple provided a sacred space for worship and prayer to God. The temple housed the Ark of the Covenant which holds the Ten Commandments of God.

By cleansing the temple, Jesus calls us to respect sacred places. The church is not a political arena. It is a sacred place where children of God honor, worship and praise God. Since business was booming, the Jews converted the area where the Gentiles were allowed to stay to worship God to a market place for the sale of sheep and for money changers. Such an abuse cries to heaven for vengeance. By driving out sheep sellers and money changers, Jesus teaches us to stand up against injustice, oppression and corruption in the world.

Jesus did not even stop at cleansing the temple; Jesus goes further to take the Jews from where they stand in their faith to where God wants them to be. Jesus says, "Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up." Jesus invites us to transition from cult worship in the temple to the worship of God in spirit and truth. While the action of Jesus in today's gospel may challenge the Jewish religious leaders and authorities to reflect on their own practices, it also goes to challenge us to re-examine our own priorities and the conditions of our hearts and minds.

It goes to mean that the true worship of God is no longer limited to the temple and its sacrifices. By His death on the cross, Jesus will become the perfect sacrifice which brings salvation to the world. This is a single act that renews both the human heart and the face of the earth. God can now be worshipped even in the comfort of our homes and wherever believers gather together to worship and praise God.

Therefore, we must avoid the temptation of mistaking signs and miracles for faith. It is not signs that lead to faith. It is faith that leads to signs. Total commitment to the things of God is what matters. When the life and the actions of the children of God are grounded in authentic faith, there will be no need to ask for signs. Signs and wonders shall abound. It is then that we begin to realize that true faith goes beyond signs and miracles. Obedience and total commitment to the word of God is all we need to experience the power of God at work in our lives and in the world.

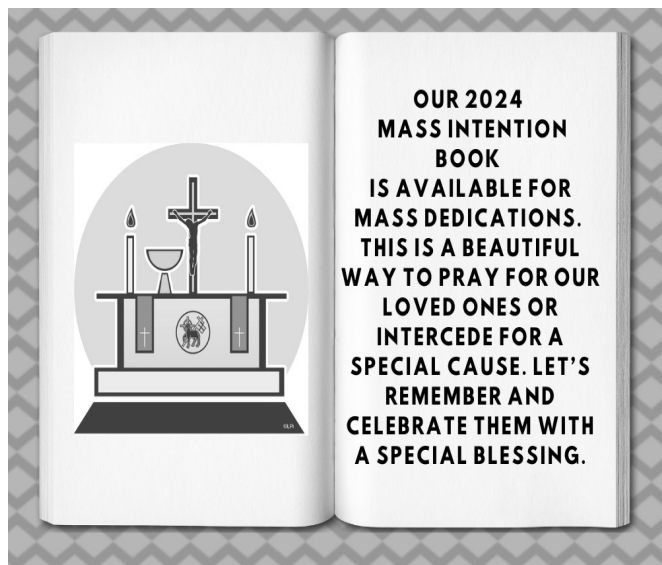

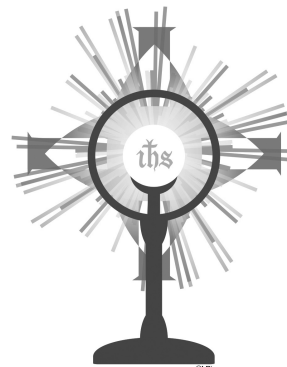
VISITA NUESTRA CAPILLA
