FROM THE PASTOR'S CORNER

Palm Sunday, Year "C"

Jesus triumphant entry into Jerusalem Hosanna, Hosanna, Hosanna to the Son of David.

Once upon a time there was a man who did carpentry work. Every morning he passes in front of a Church on his way to work. One day he made a decision to always go into the Church to greet JESUS before going to his work.

So each day he passes the Church he will go inside the chapel to say "JESUS, I'm here to greet you." He did this for many years and it became part of his daily routine.

One day he went to work as usual and fell from the roof where he was working and had a spinal cord injury. He was taken to many hospitals and there was no remedy for his injury and he became paralyzed.

One day at the hospital where he was on his sick bed without hope, his wife left him alone in the room to get something from the house. A man who dressed in white walked into the room and greeted him saying, "my friend I have come to greet you."

JESUS came to visit him since he couldn't come to visit Him as usual. And the sick man said Thank you, the visitor left and this man started to notice changes in his body, and to his greatest surprise, he got up and sat down on the bed still thinking it was a dream.

When his wife came and saw him sitting down she thought it was a ghost, raised alarm, and ran out from the room.

The doctors and nurses rushed to the room thinking the sick man was dead. When his doctor entered and saw the man sitting comfortably, he also ran back, before he decided to ask him what happened and the healed man told him all that happened.

He was visiting JESUS daily for many years but only one visit by JESUS changed his life and transformed his hopelessness into joy! (Author Unknown)

Today is Palm Sunday. Today we celebrate Jesus glorious and triumphant entry into Jerusalem. Although this entry into Jerusalem celebrates the beginning of Jesus trial, crucifixion and death on the cross, yet, this entry into Jerusalem was triumphant because it was the day Jesus came to claim what was His own from the beginning of creation – the people, the temple and the land.

Palm Sunday marks the beginning of Holy Week. The high point of the Holy Week is the Triduum when we celebrate the 3 most important days in the life of the church. The Triduum begins on Holy Thursday when we celebrate three principal mysteries namely the institution of the priesthood, the institution of the Eucharist and Jesus mandate for us to love one another as God loves us.

On Holy Thursday the priest will wash the feet of 12 chosen disciples and after the mass we shall have an opportunity to spend an hour or two with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament during the night adoration. This silent but beautiful adoration ends at midnight when the Blessed Sacrament shall be taken to the Altar of repose and the faithful shall return to their homes in silence.

The second day of the Triduum is Good Friday. This is the only day when mass is not celebrated in the Catholic Church. The communion we shall receive during the Good Friday service is taken from left over from Holy Thursday celebration. On Good Friday, we celebrate the death of Jesus on the Cross. We know that Jesus died once and for all and He will never die again, yet, on Good Friday we make new again (anamnesis) what Jesus did for us more than 2000 years ago and by so doing we become part of this salvific event that brought about human redemption.

The third day of the Triduum is Holy Saturday. This is the day the world remains silent and stands still because her savior is in the tomb. Jesus goes to the land of the dead to destroy death and liberate all who are held captive under the bondage of sin and death.

The climax of Holy Saturday celebration is the Easter vigil mass when the Exsultet is sung and new members are baptized and received into the church. On this night the faithful are opportune to renew their own baptismal promises. While some of the faithful were baptized when they were infants and their parents and godparents made some promises on their behalf, on this holy night the faithful professes and accepts to be personally responsible for those promises that were made on their behalf by their parents and godparents.

With the Easter proclamation, a new life begins - the old passes and the new begins. All the baptized become the Easter people and citizens of heaven who are privileged to call God "Abba" – Father. It is this glorious and exalted state that we shall celebrate during the 50 days of Easter season which ends with the celebration of Pentecost Sunday.

As Jesus visited the carpenter in the hospital, today Jesus comes to visit us, to heal us and to restore us to the glory of the children of God. On this day the world is divided into two between those who sing Hosanna and those who shout "Ecce Homo – Behold the man, crucify Him." The world is divided between those who are willing to defend the truth of their conviction and those who are gullible enough to follow the way of the world to condemn an innocent Jesus.

No matter where the world stands, we gather here today because we are part of the crowd that sings "Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord, Hosanna in the highest." We have gathered to glorify God so that God may glorify us. It is not by power, not by might but by the spirit, power and glory of God.

Palm Sunday becomes the celebration of human life on earth. It begins with a procession to remind us that from the time of Adam and Eve until now, life on earth has been a procession with many challenges and blessings. The procession ends at the altar of sacrifice because it is from this sacrifice that we draw strength to move on in life. If we could make an effort to stand with Jesus during our earthly procession, like Jesus, we shall emerge victorious at the end of our earthly procession. Let us walk with Jesus that we may suffer with Jesus, die with Jesus and rise with Jesus on Easter Sunday. Amen
