FROM THE PASTOR'S CORNER

Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, Year "C" God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit: One God in Three Persons

Once upon a time, a man climbed up to the mountain to meet a guru (wise man). He met the guru sitting on a rock and kind of half nodding. The man shoved the guru a little bit to wake him up. The guru said, "What can I do for you?"

The man said, "Well, I've come all the way from America, and I heard you are a very wise man, so what I really want is for you to explain to me the meaning of God, so that I will do my best to worship Him the way you do."

He was a very nice man but the guru looked at him with pity and said to him, "A god that anyone can explain is not the god that you should worship."

And this is true. God is a mystery and God dwells in inaccessible light - "God alone is immortal and dwells in inaccessible light, whom no man has seen or can see. To God be honor and eternal dominion! Amen (1 Timothy 6:16).

However, God has become visible in the person of Jesus Christ who came to show us the way to God. He suffered, died and rose from death.

Prior to His ascension into heaven Jesus said to His disciples, "I still have many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now. When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you to all the truth, for he will not speak on his own authority, but whatever he hears he will speak, and he will declare to you the things that are to come. He will glorify me, for he will take what is mine and declare it to you. All that the Father has is mine; therefore I said that he will take what is mine and declare it to you" (Jn 16:12-15).

On the day of His ascension into heaven, Jesus breathed on His apostles and said to them "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained." This mandate is intrinsically tied to what Jesus said to Peter when he declared that Jesus is the Son of God. "You are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church ... whatever you bind on earth is bound in heaven ..." (Mtt 18:18). Based on this mandate, the church affirms her teaching authority.

The dogma of the church has it that one of the foundational and fundamental truths revealed by the Holy Spirit to the church is about the true nature of God – God is a unity in trinity which comprises of God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit undivided in unity. This dogma on the Most Holy Trinity is a doctrine of faith and not of reason. There is no way that the human mind can understand or explain how God is one in three persons. Logically speaking, if something is one then it is one and if it is three then it is three, but to be one in three person and is still one God is something beyond human comprehension.

Borrowing the words of St. Augustine (354-430) and St. Anselm of Canterbury (1033-1109) belief in the Holy Trinity could be classified as "fides quaerens intellectum" – faith seeking understanding. One begins with faith in God and on the basis of faith comes to a better understanding of the fundamentals of Christian truth. What the human mind cannot comprehend, we believe, celebrate and worship in this liturgical celebration.

For lack of a better explanation, it could be said that the work of God the Father is made manifest in creation. However, even at creation it is still the trinity that is fully at work hence in the creation of human beings God said "Let US make man in OUR own image and likeness" (Gen 1:26). Even after human beings sinned, to redeem the human race the Bible says "For God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life" (John 3:16). It is out of the love between the Father and the Son that the Holy Spirit was given to us, "And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another advocate to help you and be with you forever" (Jn 14:16). It is therefore within the horizon of God's love and grace that we live, move and have our being.

However, even with this explanation, the trinity remains a mystery that the human mind cannot fully grasp. As a mystery, the more we want to understand it; upon a critical examination even what we thought we understood eludes us.

It is therefore important to note that our inability to logically explain the trinity beyond any reasonable doubt does not in any way entail that the belief is irrational. It rather means that the belief is non-rational (beyond reason) since it cannot be reduced to logical thinking – "God that can be explained is not the true God that you should worship."

Belief in the trinity invites us to be humble. In spite of human greatness and acuity, there are still so many things that we neither understand nor could explain. It is like the colors, our inability to define or explain color so that a blind person can understand it, does not mean that colors do not exist. It only goes to mean that human beings' means of communication and explaining meanings is limited and imperfect.

Since God has assumed flesh to live among us, the public face of the Trinitarian God is love. The only definition of God found in the Bible is that God is love, when we live in love, we live in God and God lives in us. Belief in the Trinity becomes a reminder that we are the products of God's love. It is out of love that God created us and out of love that God redeemed us and out of the love between the Father and the Son that the Holy Spirit is given to preserve us in holiness.

Rather than bother about understanding or decoding the mystery of the Blessed Trinity, we should instead love one another for it is love that makes the world go round. The entire Bible is an effort to reveal the love of God. Since the glory of God is a human being fully alive, it is by loving others that we live in God.

To live in the Holy Trinity is to live within the "Horizon of Grace." For believers in Christ Jesus, the fullness of life well lived is therefore, neither found nor measured by human intelligence, wealth, power or authority but by the profundity of our love for God and others.


MISA ESPECIAL


CORPUS CHRIST
