# FROM THE PASTOR'S CORNER

## 14<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year "C" "They were like a Sheep without a Shepherd"

Charles Thomas Studd was a famous English cricketer who went on to become a missionary in China, Africa and India. The youngest of the 'Studd Brothers', who were known for their cricket skills at Eton and Cambridge, Charles played in the first Test match between England vs Australia where the Ashes were named.

He was converted to Christianity along with his brothers while at Eton. At the moment he met God for the first time, he said: "right then and there joy and peace came into my soul. I knew then what it means to be 'born again,' and the Bible which had been so dry to me before, became everything."

When he decided to give up sport to pursue a career as a missionary, he said: "I know that cricket would not last, and honor would not last, and nothing in this world would last, but it was worthwhile living for the world to come."

In his twenties, he served the China Inland Mission, where he married a missionary Priscilla Livingstone Stewart. They lived in China for 10 years, but moved back to the UK due to ill health, before serving in India at a church in Ootacamund.

Later, Priscilla and the couple's four daughters stayed in England, while Charles worked in Central Africa until his death in 1931.

According to his biography by Norman Grubb, in one of his last letters home, Studd wrote: "As I believe I am now nearing my departure from this world, I have but a few things to rejoice in; they are these:

1. That God called me to China and I went in spite of utmost opposition from all my loved ones.
2. That I joyfully acted as Christ told that rich young man to act.
3. That I deliberately answered the call of God, when alone on the Bibby liner in 1910, gave up my life for this work, which was to be henceforth not for the Sudan only, but for the whole un-evangelized World.

My only joy therefore, is that when God gave me a work to do, I did not refuse to do it." (Carey Lodge, May 12, 2016).

Today, Jesus tells his disciples that there are lots of works that are needed to be done and more workers are needed to get it done. Ordinarily one may begin to wonder, if God is omnipotent – all powerful, why does God need mere humans to do the work? Wouldn't it be better for God to command from heaven and the work will be well done and done immediately?

Come to think of it, in last Sunday's gospel, during the feeding of the 5,000 men, Jesus used five loaves and two fish to do the miracle. This is not because Jesus was unable to feed the crowd without the help of five loaves and two fish, but by virtue of His incarnation, heaven and earth have been joined together as one in the person of Jesus Christ. Human beings and other created realities have become an integral part of God's plan for the salvation. Hence, all are needed in the process of human salvation

.In every generation, God chooses ordinary men and women to join in the building of the civilization of love on earth. Those who accept to embrace this call are called missionaries.

These missionaries are neither extraordinary people, nor angels, but paraphrasing Pope Francis, these are men and women "... without cassocks, without veils. Men and women who wear jeans and tennis shoes ... who go to the movies, ... listen to music, ... hang out with their friends.

*These missionaries are people who place God in first place ahead of succeeding in any career. They are people who make out time to pray every day and who know how to be in love with purity, chastity and all good things. These are people who live in the 21st century with a living spirituality, appropriate to our new time.*

*Missionaries are people that have a commitment to helping the poor and making the needed social change. These people live in the world, to sanctify the world and are not afraid of living in the world by their presence in it.*

*In every generation, the church needs such people that drink Coca-Cola ... that eat hot dogs, that surf the internet and that listen to their iPods. These are people who love the Eucharist, and are not afraid or embarrassed to eat a pizza or drink a beer with their friends.*

*The church needs missionaries who love the movies, dance, sports, and theatre. ...People who are open, sociable, normal, and happy companions. ...people who are in this world and who know how to enjoy the best in this world without being callous or mundane."*

Simply put, to be a Christian is to be a missionary. It means to follow the footsteps of Jesus. Jesus seeing the crowd like "sheep without a shepherd" showed them some love and compassion. Are we still a generation who have the desire to bring others to embrace faith in Jesus Christ? As Jesus loved and cared for people so are we expected to love and minister to the people of our time, hence we ought to be missionaries wherever we find ourselves.

On the solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus (June 24, 2022), the killer law "Roe vs Wade" was overturned. We rejoiced to see this happen not because it will bring an end to abortion but because the lives of some babies will be saved in the process. Now, given that some parents are going to give birth to babies that would have been aborted, we have the religious and moral responsibility to take care of these babies and not to let them die due to hunger and disease.

To be a pro-life missionary before birth and not be a pro-life missionary after birth makes a mockery of our belief in the sanctity of human life. Catholic teaching about life is holistic. To be pro-life is to hold on to the belief that life is sacred from the moment of conception until the moment of natural death. Both abortifacients and capital punishment are contrary to our belief in the sanctity of life. Hence, it is not for Christians to pick and choose what to believe about life.

I was once a sheep without a shepherd and you were probably once a sheep without a shepherd with little or no sense of direction and purpose, but God in His goodness reached out to us in the person of Jesus Christ. Given the complex and ever evolving interpretation of moral principles today which often confuses people, conscientious missionary effort should always be made to serve and reach out to all the "sheep without a shepherd" rather than sit at a corner to blame them. We need to have a compassionate heart like that of Jesus to be able to reach out to the poor and needy in our midst.

Atesoramos las libertades que brinda nuestro país, pero ¿son ellas la fuente real de la libertad? La verdadera libertad es un regalo que nos da Dios, no el mundo. De hecho, el mundo nos roba la libertad al atarnos a la necesidad de dinero, poder, posesiones y prestigio como vehículos para el éxito y medidas de autoestima. Aunque poseemos ciertas libertades, estamos cautivos de un sistema que no ve ningún valor en la Cruz de Cristo. No es de extrañar que Jesús enviara a sus setenta y dos discípulos al mundo con solo lo que llevaban puesto. La libertad que Dios nos ha dado es un asunto del corazón y requiere desapego de las mismas cosas de las que pensamos que no podemos prescindir. Un corazón seguro en la paz de Dios es algo que nadie puede quitar y algo por lo que realmente vale la pena morir.

Preparar a sus hijos para una situación en la que podrían perderse o separarse de usted puede ayudar a resolver una situación aterradora más rápidamente. Hable con sus hijos sobre qué hacer si alguna vez se pierden en una multitud. Primero, dígalos que se queden donde están. Enséñeles cómo localizar a otro adulto seguro (un empleado de un parque o una tienda, alguien con uniforme, otra mamá con niños) y cómo pedir ayuda. Un gran consejo para los padres de familia es comenzar a gritar de inmediato el nombre, la edad y la descripción del niño desaparecido para que otros a su alrededor también lo busquen. 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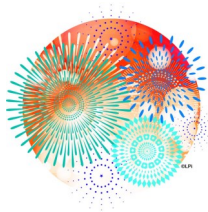
## Special Mass

- Any official document that includes name and date of birth (for example school record)

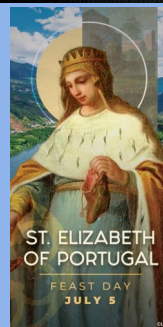
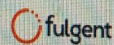

## St. Elizabeth of Portugal

St. Elizabeth was born to Peter III of Aragon and his queen Constantia in 1271. Like most royal girls of the time, she was betrothed at an early age, and was married to King Diniz (or Dinis, English: Denis) at the age of 12. Although her husband's infidelities and life of sin caused much scandal, Elizabeth was a good and pious queen. She attended Mass daily and dedicated her life to helping the poor. She established orphanages and shelters for the homeless. She also founded a convent of Poor Clares at Coimbra, Portugal.

Often called Peacemaker, Elizabeth was from her birth a reconciler of conflict. Her birth brought her father and his estranged father James to peace. Later when her own son and husband came to war out of jealousy, she rode between armies and reconciled the two men.

After King Diniz died in 1325, she went to live as a lay member at the convent of Poor Clares that she had founded. But her fight for peace was not over, she undertook a long ride to keep the army of her son Afonso IV, from fighting that of Alfonso XI of Castile. Although she was successful, she died shortly after from a fever.

Saint Elizabeth was canonized on May 25th, 1625, by Pope Urban VIII. In the
