## FROM THE PASTOR'S CORNER

## 18th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year "C" "Take care to guard against all greed ...."

It was after reading the gospel story for this Sunday that I remembered a story I once read online titled "HANDLE MISTAKES WITH LOVE." According to the story, at mass a man forgot to put his phone on silent mode even after an announcement was made before mass started. His phone began to ring in church during prayers.

The Pastor scolded him.

The worshippers admonished him after prayers for interrupting prayers.

His wife kept lecturing on his carelessness all the way home.

His co-vineyard workers shook their heads in disgust.

You could see the shame, embarrassment and humiliation on his face. He decided that he would never step his foot into that church again.

That same evening, he went to a bar. He was still nervous and trembling. He spilled his drink on the table, the bottle fell by accident and splashed on some people.

Those it touched rushed towards him. He closed his eyes expecting a bashing of words or slaps. Instead, they cared to know if he got a cut from the broken bottle.

The waiter apologized and gave him a napkin to clean himself.

The janitor mopped the floor.

The female manager offered him a complimentary drink. She also gave him a huge hug and a peck while saying, "Don't worry man. Who doesn't make mistakes?"

He has not stopped going to that bar since then (Unknown Author)."

In today's gospel, Jesus takes us from where most of us are in our family relationships to where God wants us to be – members of God's family. Our earthly families are based on blood, while our spiritual family is based on faith. Since what happens in our biological families could become an obstacle in our spiritual growth, Jesus invites us to focus on ways of improving family relationships, overcoming family problems, and breaking through family issues.

Our biological family is a strong influential force in our lives. It is from the values learned from the family that we are able to deal with the challenges we encounter in our lives. Family relationship nourishes and shapes every other relationship in our lives. Experiencing a healthy family relationship could go a long way to help us to maintain other relationships, and to persevere through difficult times.

Like the church, the family is supposed to be a place where we find and experience love. But like the church in the story above, the family could also become hell where family members are neither caring nor compassionate in their relationship with other members of the family.

In today's gospel, when the brothers had difficulty sharing their family inheritance, they thought that Jesus being a just and holy man could help them to resolve their differences; hence they brought their problem to Jesus. In dealing with the problem, Jesus makes it abundantly clear that the solution to the problem does not lie in the problem itself but in God.

As the saying goes, "where your treasure is, there your heart will be." If the brothers find their treasure in family inheritance, there are no formulae in the world that could resolve their differences and bring them peace. But, if their treasure is in God, then Jesus warns them to "take care to guard against all greed, for though one may be rich, one's life does not consist of possessions."

It goes to mean that the problem here is not their family possession but the greed in their hearts. The brothers need first to work hard to overcome greed and then they will be in a better position to share their family possession amicably. Where greed abound, not even the best of intentions could bring about peace.

Following the gospel story, Jesus calls foolish those whose priorities in life lie in wealth and not in God. It is neither wrong to ask Jesus to help resolve people's differences nor is it wrong to become successful at work. However, any human concern or achievement that takes us away from divine priorities falls short of the values of the kingdom of God.

There are many things we can learn from Jesus response – oftentimes, a family financial dispute is never only about money. "It's about who is cleverer, and who the favorite is, and who has become more successful .... It is about greed and resentment and fear and lack of trust in God. It is about living as if God cannot even now give us more than we could ever ask for."

It is also about preferring material things to human beings created in the image and likeness of God. If Jesus could die on the cross for the salvation of human beings, no sacrifice is too much for the good of others, especially for family members.

It is also about "me" and "me" and "me." Jesus suffered and died on the cross to redeem us from the "me-mentality" thus reminding us that we are interconnected and interrelated. It is only by caring for others that we can come together to build up the kingdom of God.

Christian life is an invitation to go beyond what the world expects from us. While it may be fair and just to share family inheritance in an amicable way, and while it may be fair and just to make plans about the best way to safeguard our abundant harvest, let us remember that we always have the choice either enrich ourselves or to seize every opportunity to build up a kingdom of love, peace and truth. The choice is yours.

The best inheritance worthy of celebration therefore, is the one that brings us closer to God. Hence, the author of our story goes on to say – "Sometimes our attitude as believers drives souls to Hell. We can make a difference by how we treat people, especially when they make mistakes (or when there is something to be shared). At those moments:

- \* If you cannot be a bridge to connect people, then do not be walls to separate them.
- \* If you cannot be a light to brighten people's good deeds then do not be darkness covering their efforts.
- \* If you cannot be water to help people's crops sprout, then do not be a pest destroying their crops.
- \* If you cannot be a vaccine to give life, do not be a virus to terminate it.
- \* If you cannot be a pencil to write anyone's happiness, then try to be a nice eraser to remove their sadness.

We can always be each other's keeper. Let us resolve to heal the world and make it a better place. Yes, we can. It is easier to lose soul than to win souls. Win a soul. Instead of constantly fighting for family inheritance, let us think of how beautiful our lives and our world will become should each and every one of us today make a conscientious effort to match the effort we make in sharing family possessions with the effort we make in sharing family faith, goodness and love. Amen


