

# FROM THE PASTOR'S CORNER

# 19th Sunday in Ordinary, Year "C" "Do not be afraid any longer.... Your father is pleased to give you the kingdom."

Oftentimes things happen to reveal some of the extraordinary ways God cares for us. As the story goes "It was my mother's funeral. My mother was kind and supportive. She was always there when I needed her. And I knew that she prayed for me for my entire life.

When she got seriously ill, my elder sister had a new baby and my younger brother was recently married. I had no entanglements, thus it was me, who could fully devote to taking care of mother. It was an honor.

Now, when she is gone, I found myself completely lost. "What will I do now, Lord" – I thought and felt emptiness inside. Then I looked at my brother, he sat stoically while clutching his wife's hand. My sister sat by her husband and cradled their baby. He held his arms around her.

I sat alone. So deeply grieving, nobody noticed that. My mother was my closest friend. We read Bible together. I prepared meals, helped with her visits to doctors and took her for a walk. Now my job is done and I was alone.

Suddenly I heard a door opened and then quick footsteps hurried along the floor. In a moment I saw a young man, his eyes were filled with tears. He sat next to me. Then he sniffled: "I'm late" and added: "Why do they call Mary by the name Margaret?" I whispered: "Because her name was Margaret, nobody called her Mary," I wondered why this stranger sat next to me and interrupted my grieving with his tears and fidgeting.

"Her name is Mary Peters" – he insisted. "No, that isn't right" – I replied. Then a sudden thought stroke his mind. "Is this Lutheran church?" "No, it is across the street." It was clear that the man was at the wrong funeral. This awkward situation and solemnity of the funeral bubbled up inside me, I began to laugh. Some mourners threw sharp looks at me. I looked at the man sitting next to me, he started laughing too.

I imagined my mother watching us and laughing together.

After the final "Amen" we went together to the parking lot. "Perhaps we will be the talk of the town" – he smiled and then offered "Since I have missed my aunt's funeral, maybe we could drink a cup of coffee?" I agreed.

A year after we were married at a small country church. This time we both arrived at the right place. God gave me laughter and love in my time of sorrow. Now we are celebrating our twenty-second wedding anniversary. When somebody asks, how we met, my husband tells: "Her mother and my aunt introduced us to each other. Thus, our match was certainly made in heaven" (Unknown Author).

The people of Israel lived by faith. The book of Wisdom written at the turn of the century from BC to AD (Before Christ to the time of Christ) during which Greek culture was the predominant culture of the time. It was easier at this time for the people of God to sweep their God-given culture under the carpet and embrace the Greek culture which was much more appealing to the human heart.

This is a time when Israel was persecuted from all angles by the Assyrians, the Romans, etc. It was in the midst of this struggle that the author of the book of Wisdom invited the people of Israel to become partners in progress with God and to shine their eyes to see the hand of God at work in the world and in their lives.

Ordinarily, it is easier to see the hand of God at work in joyful moments than in moments of pain and sorrow. In sorrowful moments we are prone to ask "God, where are you? God, are you silent, powerless or you do not care?"

However, moments of despair could also become moments when we are opportune take a leap of faith - to demonstrate strong faith in God. This is what the author of the book of Wisdom called on Israel to do – to have strong faith in God, serve God and keep the divine institutions.

This call for strong and unalloyed faith in God runs through the second reading and the Gospel message for this Sunday. The author of the letter to the Hebrews defines faith as "the realization of what is hoped for and evidence of things not seen." In the Gospel Jesus said that it is faith that makes us to become, "... like servants who await their master's return ... and ready to open immediately when he comes and knocks."

Authentic faith in God is a life time project. It is a way of life that should be practiced not only at mass but also in everything we do. Love is the public face of faith. As a people of faith, it is our duty to be kind and good to all and at all times.

Jesus compares authentic faith in God to the image of a steward – a good steward is always prepared to respond to his master whenever he beckons on him. The steward who goes about partying or sleeping while his master is still awake could hardly be called a good steward.

Our problem today is not that we are ignorant of the fact that God exists but that we often do things like God is not there. It is dangerous to go through life asleep because you cannot wake a person who is pretending to be asleep. It is high time for us to begin to realize that God is present when we are praying and always listening whenever we speak. Hence the best way to become a good steward is to always live, talk and walk in the presence of God

As good and faithful stewards, God has enriched and blessed us with many talents and God expects us to share our blessings everywhere we go especially with the most vulnerable in our midst – the poor, the oppressed, the widow and the orphan. We do this because if God is present in us and through us, it is our moral responsibility to do whatever Jesus will do in any situation we find ourselves. "Blessed is that servant whom the master on arrival finds doing what he is expected to do and the master will assign him a place with the faithful."

Human wisdom is enriched when it is rooted in faith. Faith in God is authentic when it moves us to do good things for God. Since every good thing comes from God, true wisdom becomes the knowledge that empowers us to become faithful and prudent stewards who are doing even now what God expects us to do.

Like the girl in our story above, God has a way of blessing and rewarding good and faithful servants. God has always done it in the past and God is still doing it today and will do it tomorrow. Let us put our trust in God and work together to make this world a better place for all. Amen

El grupo de oración, Amigos de Jesús, les invita a unirse a una noche de reflexión, alabanza y oración en comunidad. Las



## Patio Yard Sale for Vivian Ogu



Next Sunday, August 14th, from 8 am to noon, Brunie will be having a yard sale to raise funds for the cause of beatification for Vivian Ogu.

Vivian was a young lady who lived in

Nigeria from 1995-2009. She was a top-notch student, excelling in mathematics, but, more importantly, her faith and spirituality were far advanced beyond her tender years. She even helped in the catechesis of children younger than her when not attending to her own spiritual formation.

Tragically, while enjoying a quiet evening at home, Vivian was kidnapped by thieves robbing her house. They took her to the woods, attempting to rape her. Following in the footsteps of St. Maria Goretti, rather than be defiled, Vivian Ogu resisted her attackers and was executed. She became a martyr at 14 years of age while still in preparation to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation.

The Archdiocese of Benin City in Nigeria where Vivian was born and raised is championing the cause for her beatification. We pray that your continuing generosity will extend to supporting Brunie's activities to promote this noble cause. May God bless you for your generosity and love for the Church, the Body of Christ.

## Important Reminders

#### **Dear Parishioners:**

In an ongoing effort to keep all our parishioners and visitors safe and healthy while ensuring that our liturgies maintain their reverential nature, we would like to remind everyone of the following precautions we have undertaken for the good of us all:

- ◆ The virus that causes COVID-19 is still very present in our community. We ask all to be mindful about the spacing between us and others around us. Please try to make use of the open spaces often found toward the middle and front sections of the church instead of forming clusters toward the back section of pews.
- As usual, if you are feeling any cold- or flu-like symptoms, please stay at home, rest, and self-monitor. We would be more than happy to pray for your speedy recovery and rapid return to worship with us once again.
- Communion is to be taken in the hand. Once you have received the host, you must consume it immediately. If you return to your seat without consuming the host, an usher or Eucharistic minister may reach out to you to do so right away.
- To ensure the safety of our young ones, please make sure you accompany your children to and from the inside and outside restrooms.
- After the Blessed Sacrament has been reposed in the tabernacle following Communion, all may be seated while Father purifies the sacred vessels.

Thank you for your continued cooperation in protecting all members of our community, especially those most vulnerable among us, as well as the reverence of our church and the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.
