FROM THE PASTOR'S CORNER

25th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year "C" – "Prepare a full account of your stewardship"

Once upon a time, there was a Kingdom. The king there only had one leg and one eye, but he was very intelligent and kind. Everyone in his kingdom lived a happy and a healthy life because of their king. One day the king was walking through the palace hallway and saw the portraits of his ancestors. He thought that one day his children will walk in the same hallway and remember all the ancestors through these portraits.

But, the king did not have his portrait painted. Due to his physical disabilities, he wasn't sure how his painting would turn out. So he invited many famous painters from his and other kingdoms to the court. The king then announced that he wants a beautiful portrait made of himself to be placed in the palace. Any painter who can carry out this should come forward. He will be rewarded based on how the painting turns up.

All of the painters began to think that the king only has one leg and one eye. How can his picture be made very beautiful? It is not possible and if the picture does not turn out to look beautiful then the king will get angry and punish them. So one by one, all started to make excuses and politely declined to make a painting of the king.

But suddenly one painter raised his hand and said that I will make a very beautiful portrait of you which you will surely like. The king became happy hearing that and other painters got curious. The king gave him the permission and the painter started drawing the portrait. He then filled the drawing with paints. Finally, after taking a long time, he said that the portrait was ready!

All of the courtiers, other painters were curious and nervous thinking, How can the painter make the king's portrait beautiful because the king is physically disabled? What if the king didn't like the painting and gets angry? But when the painter presented the portrait, everyone in the court, including the king, left stunned.

The painter made a portrait in which the king was sitting on the horse, on the one-leg side, holding his bow and aiming the arrow with his one eye closed. The king was very pleased to see that the painter has made a beautiful portrait by cleverly hiding the king's disabilities. The King gave him a great reward (moralstories.org/a-king).

The gospel message for this Sunday is derived from the story of a steward who was reported to his Master for mismanaging his property. As to whether the accusation is true or not, we do not know but all we do know is that the steward is going to lose his job because of the accusation.

A steward is someone entrusted with the administration of his master's property. He is expected to conserve his master's property and maintain it. He is expected to maintain and grow the business and in the end turn a profit. During the time of Jesus, wealthy landowners in Palestine used to expect as much profit as possible from their stewards, hence any steward who did not deliver could easily lose his job.

From the little we know about this steward, he is not an idiot. He knows himself and he understands his limitations. Like a stockbroker, the steward must have fallen into hard times for no fault of his; however, he could not escape the fate of those who did not make much profit for their master.

The steward did not try to prove his accusers wrong. It is possible that his accusers were trying to undermine his efforts; hence the steward did not consider it necessary to fight them.

All he did was to work on himself and for himself. The steward says to himself, "Now that my master is taking the position of steward away from me, I need to do some good so that some people may receive me into their home."

As a prudent steward, he was able to come up with a plan, and he is willing to make some sacrifices to generate some long-term benefits. By granting favors to his master's debtors, the servant is able to use what he has to get what he needs.

By referring to him as a prudent steward; it is most likely that the portion he gave away to his customers was not his master's property but his own commission.

Using the shrewd behavior of the steward, Jesus calls on the children of God to become smart in their use of the things of God.

Jesus does not condone dishonesty but if dishonest people could be smart enough to use the material things within their reach to gain favors for themselves in this world, children of God should be smarter in using everything within their reach to work for the salvation of their souls.

Everything we are and everything we have come from God, and given to us for a purpose. While it is easy for us to go through life complaining about why things are not going the way they should go, it is also possible that we can do small things with great love in this imperfect world we live in.

Becoming successful in an imperfect world like ours demands that, like the artist who made the portrait of the king we should always think positive of others and as much as possible ignore people's weaknesses. We should learn to focus on the good things in life and use them to make the world a better place for all.

Another thing worthy of emulation in what the steward did is his sense of urgency. He did not doubt his master. He took him by his words and at once set out to make the best out of his predicament. Like the steward, we should not be living our lives with the presumption that there will always be tomorrow. We all have a chance in life but only few have a second chance. The right time to work for our salvation is now.

Anything we have that is not used for the service of humanity will in turn stunt our growth in the things of God. By virtue of our baptism we have become the stewards of God's creation. While we may not wait to go through the ordeals of the steward in today's parable, we still need to understand that there is never a shortage of accusations and efforts to undermine the work of the children of God in the world. At all times and in all places, let us be willing to use what we have to serve God and humanity.

Did you Know?

Babies under the age of one are at a risk of choking but handling a blocked airway in such a young child requires a different approach. If the baby cannot cough, cry, or breathe, support him "face down" by holding the head in one hand with the torso on your forearm, against your thigh. Give up to five back thumps between the shoulder blades with the heel of your other hand. If this does not work, roll the infant face up and provide five chest thrusts, about 1 ½ inches deep, with two fingers on the breastbone, just below the nipple line. ¿Sabla usted?

Los bebés menores de un año corren el riesgo de asfixiarse, pero el manejo de una vía respiratoria bloqueada en un niño tan pequeño requiere abordarlo en una forma distinta. Si el bebé no puede toser, llorar o respirar, sosténgalo "boca abajo" tomando su cabeza con una mano con el torso sobre su antebrazo, contra su muslo. Dé hasta cinco golpes en la espalda entre los omóplatos con la base de la otra mano. Si esto no funciona, ponga al bebé boca arriba y dele cinco compresiones en el pecho, de aproximadamente 1 pulgada y media de profundidad, con dos dedos en el esternón, justo debajo de la línea de los pezones. The annual raffle drawing will also take place that day.


Help make this year's raffle a success by selling or buying at least two books of raffle tickets. Tickets are available after every Mass on weekends and weekdays at the Pastoral Center.
