FROM THE PASTOR'S CORNER

34th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year "C" Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

In his study of 10 African kings whose stories must be told on film, ABS staff tells the story of "Shaka, king of the Zulus, who was born in 1787. He was the son of Zulu Chief Senzangakhona and his wife Nandi. When Shaka was 26, his father died and left the throne to a son, Sijuana. Shaka ambushed and killed Sijuana, taking leadership of the Zulus. He came to power around 1818.

Shaka was a strong leader and military innovator. He is noted for revolutionizing 19th-century Bantu warfare by first grouping regiments by age and training his men to use standardized weapons and special tactics. He invented the "assegai," a short stabbing spear, and marched his regiments in tight formation, using large shields to fend off the enemies throwing spears. Over the years, Shaka's troops earned such a reputation that many enemies would flee at the sight of them.

With cunning and confidence as his tools, Shaka built a small Zulu tribe into a powerful nation of more than a million people and united all tribes in South Africa against European colonial rule. The Zulu nation continued to use Shaka's innovations in wars after his death (ABS staff Dec 7, 2013)."

Like the Zulu people who annually celebrate the life of Shaka, it is always a joyful day whenever Christians gather to celebrate the feast of Christ, the King of kings. This solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, the King of the universe has been celebrated yearly since 1970 to mark the end of the liturgical season.

What a joyful day to celebrate the solemnity of Christ the King. Our church is beautifully decorated. I see a lot of smiling faces around me. Many people are already in the Thanksgiving mood. Children dress like it is already Christmas, but it is not yet Christmas.

Christ the King is a celebration used to mark the last Sunday of the liturgical season. Next Sunday we begin the Advent season in preparation for Christmas.

Having walked with Christ, beginning from His birth to His ascension into heaven and having been filled with the Holy Spirit to preach the Word, we are proud to say it loud

and clear to the world today that we have a trustworthy King who by dying destroyed our death, by rising restored our life and by ascending to the Father has given us the reason to live in the hope of eternal life.

Kingship, though a borrowed political concept is today used by the church to explain the relationship which a Christian enjoys with Christ who by His death and resurrection has become the Pantocrator and the Cosmocrator of the universe.

As Christ, Jesus has the whole world in His hands. Our future is in His hands and that is why we have the courage to feel safe in the world.

Our story becomes a success story because Jesus Christ is our Ebenezer. Jesus is victorious even on the cross. Not only that everything was created through Him and for Him, yet as Christ, Jesus becomes the supreme ruler of heaven and earth and everything in it.

In Jesus as the Christ, life in the world and especially for all who believe and live under His supreme authority becomes purposeful and assumes a new and deeper meaning.

Unlike the kings of the world who always act as lord over their subjects, Christ's authority is love. He rules with love, hence all who live in love live in God.

Although we may shop, eat, drive, dress etc. like others in the world, yet, knowing Christ and having a relationship with Him puts a new and unique dimension to our being in the world.

Christian life becomes a hopeful life because we worship a King who has gone through it all and is now seated at the right hand of God in heaven.

By becoming King, Jesus transforms kingship from its notion of authority to service and invites all God's children to live in the world like those who are called to serve and to give their lives as a ransom for many.

Knowing Christ the King may not make us immune to the pains, sufferings and failures of life. We still have to experience moments of joy and sadness in the world, but as prince/princess we live in joyful hope because we are victorious in Christ our King, who has prepared for those who love Him, eternal values which neither the human eyes can see nor the human mind can comprehend. Let us therefore remain in the love of the Christ who loved us first.

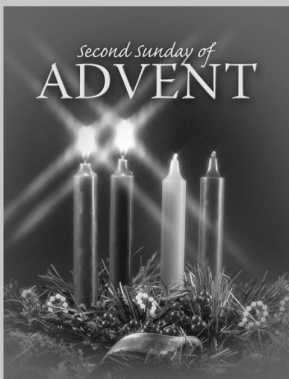

Históricamente, los reyes terrenales son figuras influyentes que ejercen un poder significativo sobre la calidad de vida de sus súbditos. ¿Dónde está el poder de Jesús? Desapareciendo lentamente, es un fracaso ante muchos ojos. El quebrantamiento y la vulnerabilidad a menudo se ven como fracasos. Algo salió mal y nos expuso, revelando nuestro ser frágil y, a veces, incorrecto a los demás. Sin embargo, lo que al principio parece vergonzoso es en realidad una llave de oro para la vida. Solo cuando somos vulnerables aprendemos a amar genuinamente. Marcando lo que parece el final de una misión fallida, Jesucristo, nuestro Rey, cuelga ante nosotros como la llave herida y vulnerable del amor y la vida infinitos de Dios. Los reinos de este mundo pasan. Jesús cuelga como nuestro rey de un mundo que nunca termina. Cuando somos vulnerables y quebrantados en la muerte, caemos en la plenitud de Cristo y somos hechos uno con él. Esto es más de lo que cualquier rey terrenal puede prometer y es la salvación que buscamos.

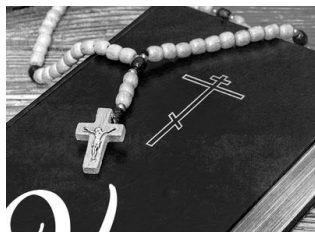
AMIGOS DE JESUS

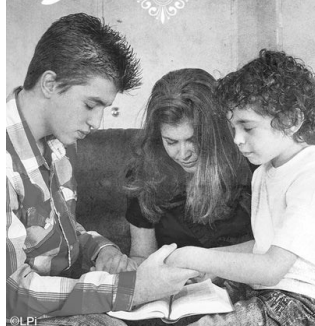
