## FROM THE PASTOR'S CORNER

## 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Lent, Year "C" – A woman caught in adultery, where's the man?

"This isn't fair!" I screamed.

The storm doors never felt like such a terror to open, as I rushed out to the front porch in tears. Just three days after our Macbook tattle-tailed my husband's double life, God called me to a form of voluntary suffering when He whispered; "Forgive Burris."

I couldn't stop shivering. "I didn't deserve this! How dare you ask me to forgive him, and this quickly!" I wrestled aloud.

Maybe it was the crisp October evening air in Northern Michigan that sent my body shuddering to keep itself warm, but I am not convinced that it wasn't the realization of this weighty truth; as a Christian, I have signed my rights away to unforgiveness.

Tears flowing down my face, I winced at the idea of this unreasonable request. You see, when I mentioned in an earlier blog post that I planned to hang my husband for his sin, I wasn't kidding. This deed of adultery was my royal flush, giving me power to avenge any pay back of my choosing.

Oh I know. I am first in line to admit that I have said yes and amen to many a sermon talking about forgiving your brother. You know the scriptures well, where Peter turns to Jesus and asks him "Lord, how often will my brother sin against me, and I forgive him? As many as seven times?" (Matthew 18:21).

Jesus said to him, "I do not say to you seven times, but seventy-seven times." (Matthew 18:22)

Ok. This is all fine and dandy when we are talking about two believers failing to be kind toward one another when they disagree about an open handed issue in the church, but we are talking about my believer husband who had been caught in adultery.

One time forgiveness felt impossible, let alone seven. It just didn't make sense.

Forgiveness would be an exchange of my "power" in the flesh, in order to receive healing and power bestowed as a gift from on high. Suddenly, I didn't feel like a mature Christian at all rather, I felt like one of the disciples who didn't count the cost of following Christ (*Lk* 14:27-33)

Forgiveness, the very basis of Christianity, is a glorious opportunity to understand the weight of the cross. Could it be that forgiveness, while utterly painful at the beginning, would be the very platform in which I would see the great cost of being a forgiven sinner? Is there a kind of suffering, for the sake of setting someone free from their debt that would usher me into the throne room of grace in a way I would have never otherwise known?

Head in my hands, I couldn't decide on that porch right then and there, but for reasons of Godly proportions, I was unable to turn away from His Whisper. Who else, but God himself, knows the pain for forgiving an adulterous person? (Leslie Burris – "Forgiving Infidelity").

Today, the 5th Sunday of Lent marks the beginning of the Passiontide. Today, the beautiful image of the cross and other images inside the church are covered with purple cloth and will remain covered until Good Friday (for the cross) and Easter vigil mass for the other holy images. We do this so that the beautiful image of the cross shall be presented anew to all the faithful.

Today, with the story of the woman caught in adultery, the church presents forgiveness as the key to understanding the power of the cross. On the cross, Jesus did for the world what the world cannot do for itself.

The undeniable truth is that the world, big though it may be, cannot save itself. Our world needs a savior. What Jesus did for the woman caught in the very act of committing adultery becomes a foretaste of the salvation Jesus will gain for the world by dying on the cross. Wonderful in our eyes is the fact that the protagonist of this revolutionary gospel story is an adulterous woman.

According to Jewish tradition, a woman caught in the act of committing adultery deserves to be stoned to death. Instead of the Pharisees who were the authorities of the law to stone the adulterous woman to death, they brought her to Jesus in order to test the authenticity of the teachings of Jesus on the mercy and forgiveness of God.

The Pharisees asked Jesus what should be done to this adulterous woman. Of interest here is to note that even though it takes two to commit adultery, no one is asking the where about of the man with whom she committed the act of adultery. In a culture where a woman has little or no right, it would have been most appropriate to question the man who is the superior, but it was the inferior that was presented for judgment and punishment.

If Jesus says, stone the woman to death, Jesus will lose the respect of his audience who have come to hold on to Him and His teachings as a message of liberation and hope. If Jesus says that the woman should not be stoned to death, the Pharisees will label Jesus a lawless person (a sinner), and will begin to argue how Jesus could come from God if he does not believe and respect the Mosaic Law.

Taking the Pharisees from where they are to where God wants them to be Jesus reveals to them that over and above human law is the divine law which is founded on love. When Jesus said to the Pharisees, "Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her," Jesus makes the Pharisees to radically transition from looking at the adulterous woman to looking at themselves. This is what we call a process of personal introspection.

How beautiful and humble we shall become should we begin to truly examine our conscience before God. Whenever human beings judge others, we condemn them but whenever God judges us, He heals us and restores us to God's love and mercy.

In Jesus a new age has dawned, an age ruled not by law but by grace. In this new age those in bondage regain their freedom, the blind see, sinners are forgiven and the lame walk. In this new age, human law is only meaningful and useful if it leads us to grow in divine law – love. All who desire to live in God's age of love and grace should, like the woman caught in adultery, look up to Jesus – carry their cross to follow Jesus, die with Jesus and rise with Jesus on Easter Sunday.
