### FROM THE PASTOR'S CORNER

## 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Easter, Year "C" "I give you a new commandment: love one another."

Sarah and her younger sister Rachel had always been close, but a bitter argument had driven a wedge between them.

Years had passed without a word exchanged between them.

Sarah often thought about calling Rachel but convinced herself that Rachel wouldn't want to hear from her.

On Good Friday, Sarah attended a service at her church.

The pastor spoke about Jesus' last moments on the cross and how, even as He was dying, He forgave those who crucified Him.

"If Jesus can forgive those who hurt Him, how much more should we forgive those we love?" the pastor said.

The words struck Sarah deeply. That night, she picked up her phone and dialed Rachel's number.

After a few rings, Rachel answered. "Hello?"

Sarah's voice trembled. "Rachel... it's me. I'm so sorry for everything."

After a moment of silence, Rachel's voice softened. "I've missed you."

On Easter Sunday, Sarah and Rachel attended church together for the first time in years.

During the closing prayer, Sarah reached for Rachel's hand.

Tears streamed down their faces as they felt the healing power of forgiveness.

Easter became a reminder that God's grace can heal even the deepest wounds.

The miracle of the resurrection also represents the miracle of restored relationships (Mark Richards – Easter Story).

Christian love was born on the cross on Good Friday and the Easter message is a message of love. This is the love that changed the world for good and forever. This is the kind of love that Jesus invites us today to embrace in our relationship with God and others.

Greater love has no one than to lay down one's life for one's friends. You are my friends if you do what I command you, and that command is to love one another as I have loved you. This is how the world will know that you are the children of God.

The sacrificial love which Jesus embraced on Good Friday for the salvation of the world is what makes the Easter story to become real. God's relationship with His children is concrete and personal. It is not a fairytale, metaphysical or theoretical construct that may need a complex formula to deconstruct. It is love in action.

Love is the principle of peaceful and meaningful existence in the world. Whenever we enter into the mystery of God's love, life becomes meaningful and worth living, but without the love of God in our hearts, life becomes a mere drudgery, hopeless and forlorn.

Love makes every human action to become reasonable. It is love that sets human beings apart from lower animals. While the actions of lower animals are principally based on their instincts, human love is a rational choice that involves the will. It is our decision to love that makes our actions noble and praiseworthy.

It is not a coincidence therefore that before ascending to heaven Jesus did not give his disciples a formula to develop a weapon of mass destruction. Jesus gave them a weapon of mass unification which is love. Love is what unites, renews and restores the divine order. Jesus empowers us with this principle which He calls a command – love one another as I have loved you.

It is love that best reflects the image of God in our life and with our love rooted in God, there is no limit to the good deeds we could do on earth. Love holds the key to human sanctification, empowerment and liberation. It is to the extent that our action approximates God's love that we shall experience freedom and happiness on earth

The command to love is new because it provides a new universal standard and parameter by which all human actions will be judged. Our actions become praise worthy or blame worthy based on how it mirrors the love of God. It is to the extent that our actions approximate the love of God that we would be found worthy to enter the kingdom of God.

Love becomes the magic wand that transforms even the most wretched soul to reflect the true image of God. Obedience to God calls for sacrifice. True glory comes not from lording it over others but through a life of faithful obedience and self-sacrifice.

In love, divinity and humanity are joined together as one. Loving God is intrinsically and intimately tied to the love we have for our fellow human beings. Failure to love our fellow human beings becomes a failure to love God.

This is not to say that we ought to accept and approve whatever other people are doing. The last time I checked, what is wrong is still wrong and what is right is still right. It may not be morally acceptable for a child of God to smile over sinful actions. However, love invites us to exercise empathy and pray for the conversion of sinners.

Love is most potent whenever it leads to a radical transformation of a person. With the love of God in our hearts we begin to see that no one is outside or beyond redemption. If God is patient with a sinner, who are we to judge and condemn them? We should be slow to judge and condemn but quick to be kind, understanding and forgiving.

Our love for others is the most powerful proof of our faith in God. "By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another."

Therefore, our love for God must bring us to work for the healing and restoration of the poor and brokenhearted. Like Jesus, our love must provide others with a second chance to start anew. We must aim and celebrate actions that bring about conversion, forgiveness and healing. Amen.

## Did you Know?

Knowing the difference between ageappropriate and inappropriate behaviors in children can help safe adults determine whether something feels "off" about a child's behavior and could indicate potential sexual abuse. For preschool children and young children (around ages 4-6), exploring their bodies is natural. They are not yet old enough to understand the idea of "private" naturally, and may also be curious about others' bodies - parents, friends, etc. These behaviors are common and developmentally appropriate for their age and stage. ### ¿Sabla usted?

Naturalmente, no tienen edad para entender la idea de "lo privado" y también pueden sentir curiosidad por los cuerpos de los demás: padres, amigos, etc. Estos comportamientos son comunes y apropiados para su edad y etapa de desarrollo. 


