FROM THE PASTOR'S CORNER

8th Sunday of Easter, Year "A" Pentecost Sunday: The Descent of the Holy Spirit

Once upon a time an elderly man went to a hospital for his routine medical check-up. When his Blood Pressure was taken, it was 120/80. The doctor on duty who was awestruck picked up the result and looked at it over and over again for about 10 minutes, and said, "Sir, this is unbelievable! You have an incredible BP. Does it mean you don't go through any stress at all? What's the secret?"

The man smiled and said, "This has been your colleagues' question overtime. I have always told them that it was a gift from God, which is correct in the actual sense. But let me tell you what has been making that gift work.

I can't wait to know the secret, the doctor interjected.

"When I was young, my father taught me that if I want to overcome negative S, I must embrace two positive S.

The doctor who was eager to know those S interrupted him again. What are the negative and positive Ss, Sir?

"The negative S includes: stress, sickness, sorrow, suffering, etc. My dad said, if I could manage stress, I won't have much health challenge. I later discovered he was telling me the truth as I embraced his two positive Ss. The man paused.

I hope no problem, Sir? The doctor asked.

"No problem, doctor. I remembered my glorious dad of a blessed memory. He was a great man, doctor.

"The positive S includes: Smile and Silence. Smile can solve problem and Silence can avoid problems. To achieve this, you must:

"Select the right people to travel with you in your journey of life at all times and make your life sweeter.

"On deity, choose the Almighty God. Thereafter, if you fail to achieve your dreams, change your ways, not your God. The trees change their leaves and not their roots.

"Stop looking sideways when you are emotionally distracted. You will never reach your destination if you stop and throw stones at every dog that barks.

"What people say should not work you up. Even when haters see you walking on water they will say it's because you can't swim. If you like, dance on water, they will accuse you of raising dust. "

"Start to live a quiet life; mind your own business; and work with your own hands.

"Social cleanliness rule is, never wrestle with a pig. Though, both of you will get dirty, but the pig enjoys it. So, knowing all these makes me to always Smile and keep Silence. That's the secret!" (Author unknown)

We are celebrating today the solemnity of Pentecost Sunday. This feast is celebrated 50 days after Easter Sunday. With this celebration we come to the end of the Easter season, which opens the door to the ordinary season of the church's liturgical year.

The descent of the Holy Spirit marks the foundation of the church for it is on this day that people of different races and tongues were united to speak with one voice in proclaiming Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior of the world.

The Holy Spirit is the third person of the Blessed Trinity. It is out of the love between the Father and the Son that the Holy Spirit is given to us. The presence of the Holy Spirit is the sign of the continued presence of God in the life of the faithful.

The Holy Spirit holds the key to happiness, and every baptized person has been given the gift of the Holy Spirit, when you were baptized in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. It is through baptism that we begin to share in the life of the Holy Spirit.

The Holy Spirit is the Spirit of love, peace and unity. On this day the division which the people of God experienced during the building of the Tower of Babel is overcome with love and the children of God are enabled again to work together to build up the kingdom of God. Hence the kingdom of God exists wherever and whenever there is love, peace and unity.

Jesus calls the Holy Spirit the advocate and counselor. Unlike earthly advocates who often abandon their clients whenever they disobey or refuse to pay them, the Holy Spirit is always there for us. This is because the love that emanates from the Holy Spirit is an unconditional love. It does not depend on human goodness but rather on the goodness of God.

The Holy Spirit directs the life of the children of God and stands for them in their time of need. It is thanks to the Holy Spirit that you and I have a second chance in life, giving us the opportunity to change from our evil ways and begin to live and enjoy the freedom of the children of God.

The Holy Spirit comes with gifts – wisdom (that we may aspire for things that last forever), knowledge (that we may know, love and serve God), understanding (that our minds may be filled with the light of the truth), counsel (that we may seek first the kingdom of heaven), piety (that we may find peace and fulfillment in the service of God and others), fortitude (that we may bear our cross with courage to overcome obstacles to our salvation and the fear of God (that we may detest whatever will separate us from God). These gifts are meant to empower us to live our lives for the glory of God and the sanctification of our soul.

The presence of the Holy Spirit defines the essential character of the church. Like the Holy Spirit which has no boundaries, the church is meant to be universal and missionary. The Holy Spirit is a spirit of sanctification. Nothing can be holy or pleasing to God unless it is infused with the spirit of God. The greatest sickness of human soul is sin. The Holy Spirit heals us from the devastating power of sin. The healing power of the Holy Spirit manifests in the forgiveness of sin - when we forgive those who offend us or when God forgives us through the sacrament of confession.

On this day the church invites us to open our hearts to receive the anointing of the Holy Spirit and to go into the world to preach the good news of salvation. We should be assured that Jesus is with us until the end of time. The love of God does not disappoint us because it has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit which has been given to us. Let us pray that the Holy Spirit may continue to renew our hearts and empower us to renew the face of the earth. Amen.
