FROM THE PASTOR'S CORNER

Easter Season, Year "C" Pentecost Sunday: Receive the Holy Spirit

It was while reflecting on the power and presence of the Holy Spirit in our lives that I remembered a story I once read online titled "Where God wants me to be." According to the story, after Sept. 11 ... a man made a call to another business man. The other man felt like talking. He was head of security of a company that had invited the remaining members of a company who had been decimated by the attack on the Twin Towers to share their office space.

With his voice full of awe he told shared stories of why these people were alive and their counterparts were dead and all the stories were just little things.

The head of the company got in late that day because his son started kindergarten.

Another fellow was alive because it was his turn to bring donuts.

One woman was late because her alarm clock didn't go off in time.

One was late because of being stuck on the NJ Turnpike because of an auto accident.

One missed his bus. One spilled food on her clothes and had to take time to change.

One's car wouldn't start. One went back to answer the telephone.

One had a child that dawdled and didn't get ready as soon as he should have.

One couldn't get a taxi.

There was one was a man who put on a new pair of shoes that morning, took the various means to get to work but before he got there, he developed a blister on his foot. He stopped at a drugstore to buy a Band-Aid. That is why he is alive today.

Now when you're stuck in traffic, miss an elevator, turn back to answer a ringing telephone ... all the little things that annoy you... it may be good to remind yourself, this may be exactly where God wants you to be at this very moment (Author unknown).

It seems to me that this is the power of the Holy Spirit of God at work in the lives of these men and women whose lives were spared. Like these women and men, we may not know why those things happened to them but at the end we could see that it all happened for a reason – their lives were saved from the catastrophic event that took place on 9/11.

Jesus understands well that we live in a dangerous world, and for us to navigate the different and evolving contours of life on earth, we need the Holy Spirit of God to guide and lead us to the truth. This truth consists in loving God with all our heart and mind and loving our fellow human beings as God loves them.

On Ascension Day, Jesus handed the baton to all the baptized, inviting us to carry on the mission of preaching the gospel on earth. Today, Pentecost Sunday marks the foundation of the church, the mystical body of Christ. Today, Jesus sends the Holy Spirit to empower us to become true and valiant witnesses of the Good News on earth.

With this celebration of Pentecost Sunday, we come to the end of the holy and glorious Easter season. Our liturgical season will continue tomorrow with the Ordinary Season of the year which culminates with the celebration of the solemnity of Jesus Christ, King of the universe on the 34th Sunday in Ordinary Time.

Calling this season "Ordinary" does not do justice to what this season is all about. This is actually a time grace and action. This is an opportune time for all baptized children of God to use their time, talent and treasure to contribute to the civilization of love on earth.

Thanks to the Holy Spirit, we are not orphans. In every baptized child of God is the indwelling of the Holy Spirit. When the disciples of Jesus received the Holy Spirit, they were empowered to speak in one tongue. The language of the Holy Spirit is the language of love.

Love leads to unity, and when the children of God are united, there is no earthly power that can overcome them. Filled with the Holy Spirit, the early Christians who used to be afraid were able to overcome their fears, and became courageous enough to witness to the truth of the gospel.

Whenever the children of God gather to celebrate Pentecost Sunday, we gather to renew our vocation to love God and others. We gather to remind ourselves that we should not fear the road ahead, for God walks with us. God's hand will guide us and God's grace will sustain us through every trial (Deut 31:6).

While the task ahead may not be easy, yet, we are assured by the presence of the Holy Spirit that we have within us all it takes to build a world where peace, justice and love reigns. This new world is only possible if we could let go of our attachment to the past, open up to the anointing of the Holy Spirit and allow the Holy Spirit to work in us and through us.

The Holy Spirit comes with gifts – wisdom (knowledge of divine things), understanding (insight into the very heart of things), knowledge (ability to judge correctly about matters of faith and right action), counsel (desire to work for the salvation of our soul), fortitude (firmness of mind in doing good and avoiding evil), piety (true reverence for God and paying due duty to our fellow human beings), fear of God (avoiding whatever will separate us from God and putting the love of God above all things).

The gifts of the Holy Spirit are heroic traits found in Jesus, and which is today shared with the mystical body of Christ on earth. We are blessed to become the beneficiaries of these noble gifts. May we remain docile to the prompting of the Holy Spirit, to grow in holiness and become fit for the kingdom of God, Amen.

Did you know?

Knowing the difference between age-appropriate and inappropriate behaviors in children can help safe adults determine whether something feels “off” about a child’s behavior and could indicate potential sexual abuse. For preschool children and young children (around ages 4-6), exploring their bodies is natural. They are not yet old enough to understand the idea of “private” naturally, and may also be curious about others’ bodies – parents, friends, etc. These behaviors are common and developmentally appropriate for their age and stage. Para los niños de edad preescolar y los más pequeños (entre 4-6 años), explorar su cuerpo es algo natural. Naturalmente, no tienen edad para entender la idea de “lo privado” y también pueden sentir curiosidad por los cuerpos de los demás: padres, amigos, etc. Estos comportamientos son comunes y apropiados para su edad y etapa de desarrollo. Sacrament of Baptism

The Sacrament of Baptism is the first step in a lifelong journey of commitment and discipleship. All Souls is happy to celebrate the baptism of children in our community. Please consider the following when preparing your child for this sacrament of initiation:

- Your child must be six years old or younger
- Parents must submit an application a month, prior to the desired date
- Parents and godparents must attend a pre-baptismal meeting in accordance with the baptism calendar.
- A donation of \$50 is requested when filling out application
- One godparent is sufficient
- The godparents should be practicing Catholics
- The godparents must be at least 16 & have received the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and First Communion
- If not single, the godparents must be married through the Catholic Church.
