FROM THE PASTOR'S CORNER

11th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year "A"

"The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few"

YOU ARE NOT HOME YET is a story about Henry Morrison and his wife who after 40 years of faithful service to the Lord as a missionary to Africa, were returning to New York. As the ship neared the dock, Henry said to his wife, "Look at that crowd. They haven't forgotten about us." However, unknown to Henry, the ship also carried President Teddy Roosevelt, returning from a big game hunting trip in Africa.

Roosevelt stepped from the boat, with great fanfare, as people were cheering, flags were waving, bands were playing, and reporters waiting for his comment, Henry and his wife slowly walked away unnoticed. They hailed a cab, which took them to the one bedroom apartment which had been provided by the mission board.

Over the next few weeks, Henry tried but failed to put the incident behind him. He was sinking deeper into depression when one evening, he said to his wife, "This is all wrong. This man comes back from a hunting trip and everybody throws a big party. We give our lives in faithful service to God for all these many years, but no one seems to care."

His wife cautioned him that he should not feel this way. Henry replied "I know you're right, but I just can't help it. It just isn't right."

His wife then said, "Henry, you know God doesn't mind if we honestly question Him. You need to tell this to the Lord and get this settled now. You'll be useless in His ministry until you do."

Henry Morrison then went to his bedroom, got down on his knees and, shades of Habakkuk, began pouring out his heart to the Lord. "Lord, you know our situation and what's troubling me. We gladly served you faithfully for years without complaining. But now God, I just can't get this incident out of my mind..."

After about ten minutes of fervent prayer, Henry returned to the living room with a peaceful look on his face. His wife said "It looks like you've resolved the matter. What happened?"

Henry replied, "The Lord settled it for me. I told Him how bitter I was that the President received this tremendous homecoming, but no one even met us as we returned home. When I finished, it seemed as though the Lord put His hand on my shoulder and simply said, 'But Henry, you are home yet!'"

The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few is an invitation which the Lord extends to men and women in every generation reminding us that the word "unemployed" does not exist in the life of a child of God.

Like the apostles, in every generation God continues to invite His children to embrace the work of evangelization – to spread the good news of salvation.

The truth is that God will not do for us what we need to do for ourselves; hence every child of God must embrace and welcome the missionary dimension of our vocation.

No matter who you are or your status in life, we must actively participate in the preaching of the word of God either by words or by good deeds. We do this by reading the word of God, praying for the success of missionary work all over the world, providing financial assistance to enable the work of God to go on in the world, promoting the reign of justice and peace in the world.

By giving us the names of the twelve apostles, the evangelist Matthew wants us to understand that these apostles were not special in any way. They were ordinary men who were called by Jesus to be with Him, learn from Him and go out to preach the word of God.

Jesus could have conveniently walked to the temple to call some members of the Sanhedrin or the priestly class to become His apostles. Jesus could have called some educated elites like the Scribes or the wealthy Sadducees to become His apostles. Jesus did not do that. Jesus called the fishermen and tax collector to become His apostles.

Jesus did not choose them because they were worthy. They became worthy because they have been chosen by God. It is the love of God that makes people worthy of the call. The good news is that even now, Jesus is still calling all the baptized children of God to become His disciples. How beautiful our world will become should all the baptized children of God decide today to become missionaries for God in the world.

Of interest is to note that the first 12 apostles had something to sacrifice or leave behind before they could follow Jesus. This is a reminder that becoming an apostle or serving the Lord is not because one is not busy or unemployed. It is out of the business of life that we make the decision to work for God by contributing our quota to the work of evangelization on earth.

To those who are willing to serve God, Jesus sounds a note of warning – "Without cost you have received, without cost you are to give." It goes to mean that salvation is God's own business. We are mere servants in the divine plan of God.

While it may be honorable and noble to serve God, yet, no one should go into reckoning with God by thinking that they have done so much for God and would expect a reward or a glorious welcome after their missionary work.

To all those who are working or have worked for God, it is not yet time to congratulate ourselves neither is it time for us to tell ourselves that we have done enough. Heaven is the home and the ultimate reward for work well done. As long as we are still in this world, our work is not yet done. We have to keep pressing on.

Nothing done for God is done in vain. There is a reward for every good deed. When human beings do not recognize or reward us appropriately, let us remember that this is because our true reward will come from the hand of God. Let's continue to do whatever we are doing for the glory of God and the sanctification of our souls. It shall be well with you, Amen

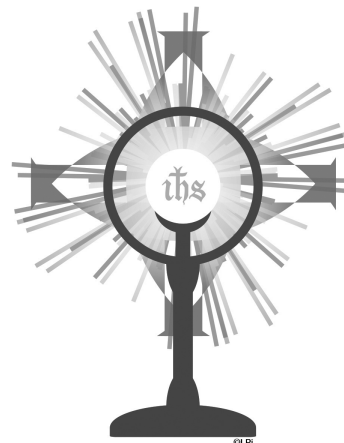
VISITA NUESTRA CAPILLA
