FROM THE PASTOR'S CORNER

14th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year "C"

The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few.

I had been working much too long on this job. I guess things could have been worse. I certainly wasn't doing hard labor. But going door to door asking questions as a representative of the federal government wasn't the most satisfying position either.

It was August. It was hot. I had to wear a tie.

"Hello. My name is Bob Perks and we are doing a survey in this neighborhood... 'I'm not interested! Good bye!'...slam, lock.

You can't imagine how many times I heard that. I finally caught on and began with, "Before you slam the door, I am not selling anything and I just need to ask a few questions about yourself and the community."

The young woman inside the doorway, paused for a moment, raised her eyebrows as she shrugged her shoulders, confused by my rude introduction.

"Sure. Come on in. Don't mind the mess. It's tough keeping up with my kids." It was an older home in a section of the valley where people with meager income found affordable shelter. With the little they had, the home looked comfortable and welcoming.

"I just need to ask a few questions about yourself and family. Although this may sound personal, I won't need to use your names. This information will be used..."

She interrupted me. "Would you like a glass of cold water? You look like you've had a rough day."

"Why yes!" I said eagerly.

Just as she returned with the water, a man came walking in the front door. It was her husband. "Joe, this man is here to do a survey." I stood and politely introduced myself....

Joe collects garbage... "We needed to live in the borough in order to work here. So we rented this home," Joe said. "When we moved in, this quote was hanging on the wall just inside the front door. It has made all the difference to us, Bob. I knew that Joe was doing the right thing," she said as she handed me the frame.

It said: If a man is called to be a street sweeper, he should sweep the streets even as Michelangelo painted or Beethoven composed music, or Shakespeare wrote poetry. He should sweep streets so well that all the hosts of heaven and earth will pause to say, "Here lived a great street sweeper who did his job well." Martin Luther King.

As an omnipotent and omnipresent God, Jesus could convert the whole world using only a single word but He did not choose to do so. Jesus invited women and men to become co-creators with Him and to join in the work of evangelization.

The sending of the 72 disciples has a lot of lessons to teach all the baptized children of God on earth. Each of us is created with a mission assigned to us. No one else has the power to fulfill your mission for you. It is something we must do to realize the *raison d'être* of our life on earth. In this mission lies our joy and happiness. It is what makes life on earth worth living.

Over and above our individual mission is a call to partner with Jesus in spreading the word of God on earth. Participation in the ministry of the word is both urgent and necessary. As Jesus said, "The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few" Every baptized child of God has a mission to spread the good news. It is not enough for us to claim ignorance of the word of God. The word of God is readily available, all we need is to dedicate our time, talent and treasure to learn, understand and contribute to the spreading of the good news on earth.

In our effort to spread the word of God, we need to depend on God and not on material things. Whenever we are moved by supernatural values, there is no limit to the good things we could do on earth. We are no longer limited by earthly desires but moved by heavenly values, we become children of the kingdom and citizens of heaven.

There is no guarantee that the messengers of the word shall always have a hitch-free missionary experience. They still have to face the challenges of life which includes the possibility of failure, rejection and abandonment. However, that is not the end of the story. Even when the world fails us or becomes violent and stubborn, we are called to remain peaceful. If we encounter a situation where we need to choose between being right and being kind, we should be kind.

God's messengers may not have all the material things they need on earth to do God's work, but the grace of God is always enough for them. God has a way of providing human angels to come to the aid of his children especially in the time of need. All we need is to trust God and know that it is a great thing to serve the Lord.

There is no need for procrastination. We need a sense of urgency and purpose in our effort to spread the word of God. This is because "The kingdom of God is near at hand." Wherever there is peace and joy, there is the kingdom of God. With strong faith in God, it is within our reach to create a culture of peace and mutual co-existence in the world.

The joy of salvation is the joy of the Lord. It does not come from conquering principalities and powers in higher places but from doing the will of God. Jesus said, "Do not rejoice because the spirits are subject to you, but rejoice because your names are written in heaven."

Finally, being a missionary does not always necessitate that we go beyond our homes and towns, we could be missionaries even in our own families and neighborhoods. Even when we are not able to preach the word of God overseas, we should be able to support missionaries who go to other parts of the world to preach the good news and pray for the success of the church's mission on earth. Amen.

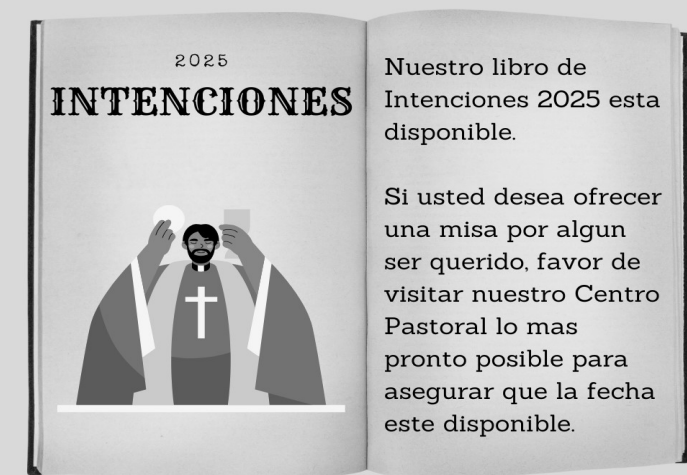
