FROM THE PASTOR'S CORNER

19th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year "C" "Sell your belongings and give alms."

Early this week, I read on WhatsApp this heartbreaking story about a little mouse caught in a trap.

Its tiny eyes were swollen with tears. Its paw was crushed. Blood stained the wooden floor beneath it.

Yet, what caught my heart wasn't the pain or the blood—but the words written beside it:

"I'm not a dangerous animal and I won't hurt you. I was just hungry."

It took me back—way back to my early years in Alagbado , Lagos State.

There was a young boy in our compound named Scott. He was always dirty, always sneaking into kitchens when no one was looking.

At least once a week, someone would shout, "That Scott don carry my garri again oh!"

I remember how we mocked him. Called him "thief."

Some adults would beat him up. One woman even tied him to a tree once, under the hot sun, for taking a piece of fried fish. But what we didn't know—what we never even asked—was that Scott was just hungry.

His mother had died when he was six. His father, a drunk, barely returned home with enough money to buy a sachet of pure water. Most nights, Scott and his younger sister slept on empty stomachs.

So, he learned to steal to survive. He learned to beg, to sneak, to be smart. And while the world saw a thief, what he truly was... was a boy in pain.

Now, years later, I see this mouse crying in a trap and I see Scott's face. I see the countless boys and girls in our streets.

I see the bus conductors who shout angrily—not because they enjoy it, but because life has never been kind.

I see the prostitutes in Allen Avenue, the young cult boys in Agege, the jobless graduates walking the streets of Lagos and Abuja. The countless prisoners in cells not because they're wicked—but because they were just hungry (I Was Just Hungry - A Cry from The Traps Of Life).

Jesus begins today's gospel message telling us "Do not be afraid any longer." Jesus knows that the fear of God is the beginning of wisdom. Fear is not

always a bad thing. Fear can move us to greatness. Fear can be our best companion if we have the right dose of it. Fear helps us to keep in view the mortality of life, hence the need to stay humble.

However, Jesus understands how fragile life on earth could become especially as we get older or nearing retirement. There is need to plan for the future and prepare for the last stage of life when we have a limited strength, income, few friends and a limited relevance in the eyes of others.

This is a time to enjoy life, not a time to live in fear. Fear makes human life tasteless, empty and miserable. Fear turns human life into a problem to be solved and not a joy to be celebrated and shared. Without faith, all we have is fear. With fear, all we have is argument, conflict, rivalry and competition.

Jesus does not want the children of God to live with fear. Christian life is a life of joy, a life that should be lived in harmony with God and others. The commandments of God are very important; yet, Christian life is not about a mere observance of laws but a celebration of God's love.

Even though the Last Judgment is true, yet, Christian life is not about judging or condemning others for the sins they have committed. Christian life is a call to serve. It is a life of sacrifice and only those who are willing to do so could truly identify with the Jesus project.

When Jesus says "Sell your belongings and give alms" Jesus understands that we need some material things to be able to survive. Human need for housing, food, clothing, love, etc. is real and necessary. This is why Jesus admonished Christians to feed the hungry, clothe the naked, visit the sick, and to give water to those who are thirsty.

Christian life should be lived for the sake of the kingdom of God. "Sell your belongings and give alms" is an Aramaic way of expressing the importance of the kingdom of God. Seeking the kingdom of God and its righteousness should become the greatest desire of human heart and no sacrifice is too much to make in order to go to heaven.

Fear limits our world-view, creativity and true sense of belonging. When we live with fear, we waste so much time setting traps to catch all the hungry rats on earth instead of looking for ways to feed and help them. The time we waste judging and condemning others could be better used to help the sick, feed the hungry and work to promote the reign of peace and justice on earth.

Jesus teaches us today that Christian life is a culture. It is a lifetime project. It is a way of life that is not seasonal. We are reminded that Jesus will come at an expected time and "Blessed are those servants whom the master finds vigilant on his arrival." This reminder is not for us to live in fear, but for us to keep doing good deeds at all times.

To be able to do the will of God, we need a strong faith like Abraham who looked up to God as the source of all that is good. As we get older in life, we should look at the past with a sense of gratitude and face the future with hope, faith and love. Whenever we face the challenges that come from ill health, loss or separation from loved ones, divorce, betrayal, etc. we can trust God without fear, knowing that our eternal inheritance is secure. Amen.



National Needs Combined Collection


