FROM THE PASTOR'S CORNER

25TH Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year "A"

"Peter! Pick up your toys!" – said his **mom** for the fifth time. But Peter was so excited with his new **video game**, that he didn't **obey his mother**.

"Please, Peter, I'm not repeating myself, it's time to have a shower and then eat dinner".

Peter reluctantly stopped **playing** the last video game of a game saga he was collecting; "Pirates from the cursed island". It was super interesting.

After dinner, his mum asked Peter to help her clear the table, but Peter ran to his room to continue playing the video game, instead of picking up the dirty dishes

- "This kid is such a disaster! Have you seen the bathroom? Peter, pick up your clothes! Peter! Peteeeeeeer!!"

The next day, Peter woke up wondering why his **mom** hadn't called him at the same time as always to go to school. He went downstairs to the kitchen and what a surprise when there at the table sat was *One-eyed Captain*! the **pirate** from his video game!

"Bu...but...where is my mum? What are you doing here?"

"Your mum does not live here anymore; she got tired of you ignoring her every time she asks you to do something. Now, I will live in your house with my crew, and you will do everything we order you to do".

"Bu...bu...but..." "But nothing, I was waiting for you to wake up to prepare my **breakfast**. Hurry up, my crew is about to come."

Peter started working, preparing breakfast for the whole crew, and then had to clear the table, wash the dishes and tidy up the kitchen.

After many **adventures** through the **seven seas**, the Captain and his crew wanted to take a bath. After the bath, Peter had to pick up all the clothes and clean all the mess in the bathroom.

Peter spent the whole day following the pirates, picking up everything around. When night time arrived, Peter was very tired, and he asked the pirates to help him with the cleaning. The Captain looked at him and all of them started laughing. Then Peter woke up.

He then understood that it had all been just a dream, and thought: "My mum might be as tired as I was in my dream every night - From now on I'm going to help her, and I'm going to clean and tidy up."

That day, His mum could not believe what she was seeing. Peter helped her to clear the table and he picked up his clothes. She didn't understand what was going on. Only Peter knew every time he looked at his video game (Mendez R. G "PETER DOES NOT OBEY").

Today's gospel story is an interesting one. A first look at the parable of the laborers in the vineyard seems to emphasize more on the importance of hard-work but a second look at the parable seems to emphasize more on obedience and loyalty to God.

Of course, we know that the master of the vineyard is God and Israel is the vineyard of God. The first laborers called to work in the vineyard are the Jewish people through their father Abraham and the last hour laborers are the Gentiles who were regarded as sinners or commoners during the time of Jesus.

Like human masters, God did agree to pay the first laborers that were hired a fair wage approved by law at the time. Since the laborers that were hired at noon and afternoon knew that they were not entitled to a fair wage, they abandoned their fate to the generosity of the Master. By so doing we have two groups of laborers – those who feel entitled to a fair daily wage and those who did not feel entitled to a fair daily wage.

Surprising is that at the end of the day both those who "worked hard" - did a full day work and those who "did not work hard" - worked for few hours, received the same amount of money. Going by human standard, justice is done when those who worked more hours receive more money than those who worked for few hours, but, that was not the case in this parable.

Saying "YES" to God is all it takes to receive a fairly daily wage (become blessed). It does not matter whether one has been a Christian for one day or 100 years, all that counts is that we agree to work in the Lord's vineyard and that we do our work with all our heart, mind and strength. While human reward can be measured, God's blessings are immeasurable.

In a capitalistic society like ours, hard work is always romanticized as key to success. "In the business world, idioms about how sleep is for the weak or how no amount of talent can supersede hard work were doled out for decades. The underlying assumption was that if you worked hard enough for long enough, you would succeed. However, this advice misses one big point: Most people fail not because of a lack of effort but because their effort was misdirected or misaligned with their interests" (Utkarsh Amitabh).

This is not to say that hard work is not important. Hard work does matter for success, but while hard work and success are most certainly correlated, correlation is not causation. It is often said that it is not "who you are but who you know that counts." While it is reasonable to draw from this parable important lessons about God's generosity, equality of all human beings in the eyes of God, grace as an unmerited favor, etc. we need to learn that all that matters in life is to say an unconditional "YES" to God.

It does not matter whether we became a Christian as a child, adult or on our death bed. All that matters is to make a daily conscientious effort to work in the vineyard of God and to fine-tune our will to the will of God. And like the last hour laborers we should do so without any attitude of entitlement but with a spirit of abandonment, because we have come to know, understand and believe that whatever is done for God shall always be rewarded beyond human expectation.

A key part of creating a safe environment is being a trusted adult to the children in your care. Children who have been abused are more likely to confide in a trusted adult whom they know will listen to and believe them. For this reason, it is important to affirm a child's everyday emotions, including anger or fear. Far too often, adults tell children "you're fine," or "get over it," in response to what a child perceives as a true emotional problem, but an adult may see as an inconvenience or insignificant event. Affirming a child's feelings while still helping them work through their issue productively will help create a bond of trust. Una parte clave de la creación de un entorno seguro es ser un adulto de confianza para los niños bajo su cuidado. Los niños que han sido abusados tienen más posibilidades de confiar en un adulto de confianza que saben que los escuchará y les creerá. Por esta razón, es importante afirmar las emociones cotidianas de un niño, incluido el enojo o el miedo. Con demasiada frecuencia, los les dicen a los niños "estarás bien" o "supéralo", es respuesta a lo que un niño percibe como un verdadero problema emocional, pero un adulto puede verlo como un inconveniente o un evento insignificante. Afirmar los sentimientos de un niño y al mismo tiempo ayudarlo a resolver su problema de manera productive ayudará a crear un vínculo de confianza. 




Deepest Condolences
