# FROM THE PASTOR'S CORNER

# 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of Advent, Year "B" – "Prepare the Way of the Lord"

A woman was Christmas shopping with her two children. After many hours of walking down row after row of toys and after hours of hearing both her children asking for everything they saw on those many shelves, she finally made it to the store elevator with her two children in hand.

She was feeling what so many of us feel during the holiday season time of the year, getting that perfect gift for every single person on our shopping list, overwhelming pressure to go to every party, every housewarming, taste all the holiday food and treats, making sure we don't forget anyone on our card list, and the pressure of making sure we respond to everyone who sent us a card.

Finally the elevator doors opened revealing a crowd in the elevator car. She pushed her way in and dragged her two kids and all her bags of stuff in with her. As the doors closed she couldn't take it anymore and blurted out, "Whoever started this whole Christmas thing should be found, strung up, and shot."

From the back of the car, a quiet calm voice responded, "Don't worry, we've already crucified Him."

The rest of the trip down was so quiet you could have heard a pin drop. Don't forget this year to keep the One who started this whole Christmas thing in your every thought, deed, purchase, and word. If we all would, just think how much better this world would be (TruthBook – "The Reason for Christmas").

Christmas celebration falls within the holiday season. During this time of the year farmers have harvested their crops and stored them in the ban. This is the time to rest from farm work. Now, there is enough food in store. This is an opportune time to celebrate and thank God for a bountiful harvest. Shopping during this season is not abnormal. It is to say the least an essential aspect of the season.

However, from the mouth of John the Baptist we are told today that shopping is not the main reason for the celebration of Christmas. The incarnation of God – that God assumes flesh to live among us in an invitation to spiritual renewal through prayer, repentance and forgiveness of sins.

John the Baptist was an inter-testamental prophet chosen by God to prepare the way for the coming of the Messiah – the Son of God. The presence of John the Baptist marks the end of the Old Testament and the beginning of the New Testament. John the Baptist lived a very austere lifestyle. He lived most of his life in the desert and he fed on locust and wild honey.

When John the Baptist appeared on the scene, he called the nation of Israel to repent and believe in the gospel – the good news of salvation. John demanded that those who believe should be baptized as a sign that they have abandoned the life of sin and wickedness

and are willing to walk along the path of goodness, justice, mercy and kindness. From the mouth of John the Baptist we hear how best to prepare our minds to welcome and celebrate Christmas. John's voice is one that cries out from the desert saying "Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths."

Advent season is a holy season. It is a graceful time. It makes a personal and direct call for each and every one of us to prepare for change. John the Baptist's call to repentance is a reminder that change is the only constant in life. A bad person today has what it takes to change to become a good person tomorrow and a good person today if he fails to hold on to the truth may end up becoming a bad person tomorrow. Changing for good or persevering in good deeds requires vigilance through prayer, fasting and corporal works of mercy.

The radical change that John the Baptist is calling the children of God to embrace requires that we humble ourselves so that God may lift us up to a greater height. All the active players in the story of Christmas are humble human beings going from John the Baptist, Joseph to Mary.

Humility opens the human heart to embrace higher values. It is borne out of the realization that we do not know it all, hence the need to leave some room for the unknown. This is the realm of mystery and this is the realm where God reveals His Godhead. It is only those who hunger for purpose, meaning and grace that welcome the divine in their lives.

From John the Baptist we learn that forgiveness is the public face of a humble and contrite heart. John the Baptist invites us to embrace the liberating and transformative power of forgiveness for the bad things we did in the past. When we ask for forgiveness or when we forgive others we are not doing them any favor, we are rather liberating our minds to recognize the presence and power of God in the world.

Furthermore, by preparing the way for the Lord, John the Baptist invites all the children of God to prepare themselves for a higher calling. This is an invitation to live a purpose driven life. It is sad to say that Children of God do not always recognize and appreciate who they are – that they are human beings created for higher values, endowed with beauty, goodness and truth, hence the need to live and work for justice, peace, joy and the integrity of all sentient beings.

The voice of John the Baptist is the voice of truth and conscience. John the Baptist's boldness in proclaiming the truth serves as a lesson for the children of God to be courageous in standing up for what is right, true and noble. This is thanks to our baptismal calling which renews, sanctifies and invites us to live a new way of life.

Therefore, the arrival of the messiah which John the Baptist advocates for in today's gospel does not demand that we look up to heaven and wait for Jesus to come from the sky. It is a radical call for each and every one of us to make a deeper connection with God and to become co-creators with God in the building of just and fair society where human beings live in peace and harmony.


