FROM THE PASTOR'S CORNER

4th Sunday of Advent, Year "B"

"Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord"

Halfway through December we were doing the regular evening things when there was a knock at the door. We opened it to find a small package with a beautiful ceramic lamb inside. We looked at the calendar and realized that the 12 days of Christmas were beginning!! We waited excitedly for the next night's surprise and only then, with the gift of a matching shepherd, did we realize that the lamb was part of a nativity set.

Each night we grew more excited to see what piece we would receive. Each was exquisitely beautiful. The kids kept trying to catch the givers as we slowly built the scene at the manager and began to focus on Christ's birth.

On Christmas Eve, all the pieces were in place, but the baby Jesus. My 12 year-old son really wanted to catch our benefactors and began to devise all kinds of ways to trap them. He ate his dinner in the mini-van watching and waiting, but no one came.

Finally we called him in to go through our family's Christmas Eve traditions. But before the kids went to bed we checked the front step – No Baby Jesus! We began to worry that my son had scared them off. My husband suggested that maybe they dropped the Jesus and there wouldn't be anything coming. Somehow something was missing that Christmas Eve.

There was a feeling that things weren't complete. The kids went to bed and I put out Christmas lights, but before I went to bed I again checked to see if the Jesus had come-no, the doorstep was empty. In our family the kids can open their stockings when they want to, but they have to wait to open any presents until Dad wakes up. So one by one they woke up very early and I also woke up to watch them.

Even before they opened their stockings, each child checked to see if perhaps during the night the baby Jesus had come. Missing that piece of the set seemed to have an odd effect. At least it changed my focus. I knew there were presents under the tree for me and I was excited to watch the children open their gifts, but first on my mind was the feeling of waiting for the ceramic Christ Child.

We had opened just about all of the presents when one of the children found one more for me buried deep beneath the limbs of the tree. He handed me a small package from my former visiting teaching companion....

As I took off the bow, I remembered my friendship with her and was filled with gratitude for knowing her and for her kindness and sacrifice this year giving me a gift. But as the paper fell away, I began to tremble and cry. There in the small brown box was the baby Jesus. He had come!

I realized on that Christmas Day that Christ will come into our lives in ways that we don't expect. The spirit of Christ comes into our hearts as we serve one another. We had waited and watched for him to come, expecting the dramatic "knock at the door and scurrying of feet" but he came in a small, simple package that represented service, friendship, gratitude, and love.

This experience taught me that the beginning of the true spirit of Christmas comes as we open our hearts and actively focus on the Savior. But we will most likely find him in the small and simple acts of love, friendship and service that we give to each other. This Christmas I want to feel again the joy of knowing that Christ is in our home. I want to focus on loving and serving. More than that, I want to open my heart to him all year that I may see him again (Gaye Willis – "Will the Christ Child come?").

Today is the 4^{th} Sunday of Advent and the last day of the Advent season. Tonight we begin the vigil mass of Christmas. Tonight we unite our hearts, soul and mind with people of faith of all ages to pray and celebrate the event that united heaven and earth in the person of a child born in Bethlehem in Judea. And the child's name is Immanuel – God is with us.

Christmas story is always a heartwarming story that brings smiles on our faces and in our hearts. It is a story that brings joy to our heart and lifts our minds to unimaginable dimension. It evokes in us a pure joy that makes us to realize that we are created for something greater than ourselves.

Today's gospel story invites all who wish to be enriched with the wealth of Christmas blessings to imitate the humility of the Blessed Virgin Mary, mother of Jesus Christ. Mary's response to angel Gabriel shows a profound humility which even great kings like David and Ahaz did not have. As Mary accepted her role in the plan of salvation, so are we invited to do whatever we can to bring God's love, peace and joy to all during this holy season.

Mary's immediate and unquestioning obedience to God's plan demonstrates the importance of listening and obeying the voice of God – "I am the handmaid of the Lord, may it be done to me according to your word." This divine guidance will always be revealed to us through our daily encounters with others.

Mary's courage and willingness to embrace a challenging and unconventional path is also worthy of emulation. In this life good things may not always come to us in a conventional or well known ways. Our ability to open our heart to God's plan for our life may take us to unfamiliar territories.

Blessed is the one who has the courage to surrender to the will of God.

Finally, more than the humility, courage and surrender of Mary, is her unalloyed faith in God. A person of faith will always see what one with a microscope or telescope will not be able to see. Mary's faith in God's promises despite the inconveniences it brought to her life serves as an inspiration for us to always trust in God's plan, for the one with God has a reason to rejoice. We are already a Christmas people, we are called to rejoice, celebrate and be happy. Amen



Did you Know?

One of the best ways safe adults can help children who are suffering from abuse is to recognize and listen to their disclosures — even if they are done in stages or in subtle ways. A child may float a "trial balloon" disclosure, meaning he may use a single sentence or phrase to see if a safe adult will respond appropriately. Be on the lookout for sudden disclosures like, "I don't want to go to So-and-so's house anymore," and try responding in a way designed to let the child continue to open up: "Do you want to tell me why?" or "Let's talk about that," for example. ¿Sabla usted?

Un niño puede revelar un "globo de prueba", lo que significa que puede usar una sola oración o frase para ver si un adulto confiable responde apropiadamente. Esté atento a revelaciones repentinas como: "Ya no quiero ir a la casa de Fulano de tal" e intente responder de una manera diseñada para permitir que el niño continue abriéndose: "¿Quieres decirme por qué?" o "Hablemos de eso", por ejemplo. AMIGOS DE JESUS


