# FROM THE PASTOR'S CORNER

# Christmas Season, Year "B" The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph

Each December, I vowed to make Christmas a calm and peaceful experience. I had cut back on nonessential obligations...extensive card writing, endless baking, decorating, and even overspending.

Yet still, I found myself exhausted, unable to appreciate the precious family moments, and of course, the true meaning of Christmas. My son, Nicholas, was in kindergarten that year. It was an exciting season for a six year old. For weeks, he'd been memorizing songs for his school's "Winter Pageant." I didn't have the heart to tell him I'd be working the night of the production. Unwilling to miss his shining moment, I spoke with his teacher. She assured me there'd be a dress rehearsal the morning of the presentation. All parents unable to attend that evening were welcome to come then. Fortunately, Nicholas seemed happy with the compromise.

So, the morning of the dress rehearsal, I filed in ten minutes early, found a spot on the cafeteria floor and sat down. Around the room, I saw several other parents quietly scampering to their seats. As I waited, the students were led into the room.

Each class, accompanied by their teacher, sat cross-legged on the floor. Then, each group, one by one, rose to perform their song.

Because the public school system had long stopped referring to the holiday as "Christmas," I didn't expect anything other than fun, commercial entertainment...songs of reindeer, Santa Claus, snowflakes and good cheer. So, when my son's class rose to sing, "Christmas Love," I was slightly taken aback by its bold title.

Nicholas was aglow, as were all of his classmates, adorned in fuzzy mittens, red sweaters, and bright snowcaps upon their heads. Those in the front row – center stage – held up large letters, one by one, to spell out the title of the song.

As the class would sing "C is for Christmas," a child would hold up the letter C. Then, "H is for Happy," and on and on, until each child holding up his portion had presented the complete message, "Christmas Love."

The performance was going smoothly, until suddenly, we noticed her; a small, quiet, girl in the front row holding the letter "M" upside down – totally unaware her letter "M" appeared as a "W". The audience of 1st through 6th graders snickered at this little one's mistake. But she had no idea they were laughing at her, so she stood tall, proudly holding her "W".

Although many teachers tried to shush the children, the laughter continued until the last letter was raised, and we all saw it together. A hush came over the audience and eyes began to widen. In that instant, we understood the reason we were there, why we celebrated the holiday in the first place, why even in the chaos, there was a purpose for our festivities.

For when the last letter was held high, the message read loud and clear: "CHRISTWAS LOVE" And, I believe, He still is!!

God certainly does work in mysterious ways!! (TruthBook - "Is there a W in Christmas").

We are celebrating today the solemnity of the Holy Family - a visible sign of God's love. This is a family that stood firmly for Christ. It is a family that cooperated fully in the fulfillment of salvation history. This family is presented to us today as a model to emulate.

It is interesting to note that going by worldly standard and meaning of a successful and happy family, the Holy Family did not have it easy here on earth. Theirs was a life full of suffering and pain.

Mary, a virgin was found to be pregnant with a child through the power of the Holy Spirit. Mary could not humanly comprehend what it means to be impregnated by the power of the Holy Spirit. How could anyone expect Mary's neighbors to understand and agree with her account of the encounter with the archangel Gabriel?

In such a primitive culture where pregnancy out of wedlock incurred a capital punishment, Mary's fears are worries would be unimaginable and unequalled. Did Mary's parents believe her story of an encounter with angel Gabriel? We could hardly imagine the caricature people around her made with her name – "we thought she was a virgin," "we thought she was God-fearing," "we thought she came from a good family," "we thought she was a holy girl," etc.

How could Mary endure all these caricatures which were accompanied with the threat of a secret divorce from her husband to be, Joseph? Of course, Joseph had every reason to be disappointed and to doubt the authenticity of Mary's story.

Even more than 2000 years after this encounter took place, none of us today can explain how it is possible to conceive by the power of the Holy Spirit. However, it is what the human mind cannot comprehend that we are celebrating today in faith.

Now, as a people who have come to a better understanding of Mary's story, we are proud to call them a Holy Family. This is thanks to their unconditional love and deep faith in God. Rather than shape God in their own image and likeness, they allowed themselves to be formed and shaped in the image and likeness of God.

From the Holy Family, we learn that salvation is God's own business. We are all instruments in the hands of God. If we could allow God to be God in our lives, great things happen and there will be no limit to what God will do with us, in us and through us.

As we are about to enter the New Year, we know that a New Year is full of surprises. New Year makes for a new beginning, new opportunities, new choices and new blessings. Even when things are not going the way we would like them to go, let us look up to the Holy Family, for with God nothing is impossible. We need to enter the New Year with the blessed assurance that God is with us. We need to hold on to God and avoid fear which is an enemy of progress.

Therefore, all who wish and pray that the story of their life will become a story with a happy ending are called to follow the footsteps of the Holy Family. We need to humble ourselves before God and open our hearts to the will of God. There is no guarantee that things will always be easy for us but it is a blessed assurance that in God blessings abound and with perseverance God will turn the **M** into **W** and the story of our life will become like that of the Holy Family, a story with a happy ending. Amen



# ¿Sabla usted?



## VISITA NUESTRA CAPILLA




